COURSE PURPOSE AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

The purpose of this course is to study, apply, and evaluate quantitative and qualitative research methods employed in scholarly communication research. Accordingly, upon completion of this course, you should be able to:

- 1. explain the ways of thinking behind communication research;
- 2. identify the differences between the research perspectives and paradigms;
- 3. evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of data sources;
- 4. develop an annotated bibliography and literature review;
- 5. describe the standard, proper, and ethical way in which to conduct communication research;
- 6. discuss the importance of validity, reliability, and credibility in communication research;
- 7. identify under what conditions, research questions, and study objectives that quantitative/qualitative research are appropriate; and
- 8. explain how to read, write, evaluate, and critique quantitative/qualitative research reports.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Three exams. You will take three exams that include multiple-choice and open-ended questions. The first two exams are worth 100 points each and the third exam is worth 150 points.

2. Annotated bibliography. Focusing on a topic of your choice, you will annotate peerreviewed academic journal articles you plan to incorporate into your literature review. This assignment is worth 100 points.

3. Literature review (rough draft). Focusing on a topic of your choice, you will

develop a literature review that includes introduction, rationale, and literature review sections. This assignment is worth 50 points.

4. Peer review feedback. Based on feedback you received from me, you will edit your literature review and submit a peer review draft to your assigned peer review partner. You will read your peer review partner's peer review draft and provide feedback that identifies strengths and areas for improvement that you will submit to your peer review partner and me. This assignment is worth 25 points.

5. Literature review (final draft). Based on feedback you received from your peer review partner and me, you will edit your literature review and submit a final draft. This assignment is worth 250 points.

6. 3 Minute Thesis presentation. You will prepare and deliver a compelling oration on your literature review and its significance that consolidates your ideas so they can be presented to a non-specialist audience. This assignment is worth 50 points.
